INTRODUCTION

As a Junior Travel Ambassador (JTA), your job is to make travelling to and from school safer and more active for your friends and classmates. You can also help prepare year six pupils for their journey to secondary school.

This manual gives you all the information you need to research, plan, promote and deliver safer, active and independent travel activities in your school. These can be assemblies, competitions and events.

You should have already received your new JTA badge and resource pack. Wear your badge at all times so everyone in your school knows the important job you have.

If you haven't received your badge as yet, please speak to your borough School Travel Advisor or Road Safety Officer.

One of your teachers or a member of staff in your school will be your JTA Guide. You can also ask your borough School Travel Advisor, Road Safety Officer or local Police Officer for advice.
