

Connected Croydon Street Improvements reach New Addington

As part of the £50m Connected Croydon programme, work started in January to carry out further improvements to the look and feel of Central Parade. The works are jointly funded by the Council and the Mayor of London and are being delivered by Croydon Council.

Planned improvements include:

- widening and repaving the pavement with high quality paving
- raising the level of the pavement to create step-free access into more commercial premises
- installing additional seating, litter bins and cycle parking, making better parking provision for blue-badge holders
- repairing and resurfacing the carriageway in front of the shops
- installing new, brighter, low-energy lighting.

How will people be affected during the works? The works commenced in January with the roll out of new street lighting and finish in early summer. To lessen disruption we will be carrying out the works in short stretches at a time, maintaining access to all doorways and stairways throughout.

We will not start work before 7am and will generally not work after 7pm. When we need to work later (for instance to resurface in front of doorways) we will let affected premises know in advance.

Parking and traffic:

To ensure the improvements are carried out safely, we will need to temporarily suspend some parking

bays along the access road at various times during the course of these works. You will be unable to park in the car park nearest the CALAT Centre during the works but the recycling point will remain open.

Sections of the road in front of the shops will need to be closed for short periods to enable us to connect the new drainage to the sewer and to enable us to resurface the road.

Signs warning of upcoming closures will be displayed on site in advance of any works.

The Market will be unaffected during the construction works and will be able to

operate as normal.

This is a great opportunity for New Addington and we will be working hard to ensure works are completed to schedule with as minimal disruption as possible to residents and businesses.
