I. About this report


This report summarises the findings of two community events that were held in November 2019, to start to develop the Selsdon Community Plan. The information boards from these events can be viewed as an attachment on this page.


II. What is the Selsdon Community Plan (SCP)?

The Selsdon Community Plan (SCP) (2020 – 2025) aims to identify the community's priorities for investment in community infrastructure and services aiming to change the Selsdon Community for the better by:-

- o Building a pleasant, modern, healthy environment respectful of our heritage, fit for our future
- o Nurturing sustainable local businesses to secure high quality jobs for local people
- o Creating a connected, collaborative, welcoming community of which residents are proud

The SCP is being led by a team made up local groups, churches, ward councillors, Croydon Council, local businesses and schools.

The plan includes the local centres of Addington Village, Forestdale and Selsdon high street.



III. Engagement so far

We now want to hear from as many people as possible and have launched an online survey closing 1st March 2020.




During this period we will be engaging with local schools and local residents groups to get further feedback from them on what their priorities are for improving Selsdon.

i. What do you Like and What would you Improve?








'I like the yearly Christmas Lights'




'More raised beds along wider pavements with bulbs for spring and then planted with veg'





'I like the Christmas market and it should happen every year. Also maybe another market in the year'




'Better and cheaper public transport. More street trees.


'Stricter parking controls on high street - schools/shops cause so much traffic backlog where people dump their cars anywhere'
















b. Youth and Community

'Get a central CCTV camera on the high street linked to the council. Get shop keepers to share external CCTV views with the police'






'Keep supporting the Friends of Selsdon and Friends of Littleheath woods groups. Involve local school'





'We need adult education classes, not just ESOL or maths, but arts and crafts, e.g. jewellery making, stained glass, pottery, upholstery'


'Outdoor Gym - on Edgecoombe Park also Selsdon Rec'

'Make more accessible routes in the green spaces for people with disabilities'










'Use one of the empty shops to show case local talent'
